10. Simulation: "Meeting the Kainai"

Name of the simulation	Meeting the Kainai
Sequence of the simulation	 Children enter the room and take a seat around the fireplace. It is a calm and cozy atmosphere. They are welcomed by the Kainai-Indians (students) who tell them that they like to sit together and tell stories. One of the Kainai-Indians keeps a chain and explains the tradition of the pearls. Every pearl stands for a different element of the story. The Kainai-Indians and the children read the text of the traditional song "Oh Siem". Then, they sing the song. The Kainai-Indians tell the story of the "Milky Way". The children get a leather band and a pearl. The song is sung once again by the whole group. The children leave the room.
